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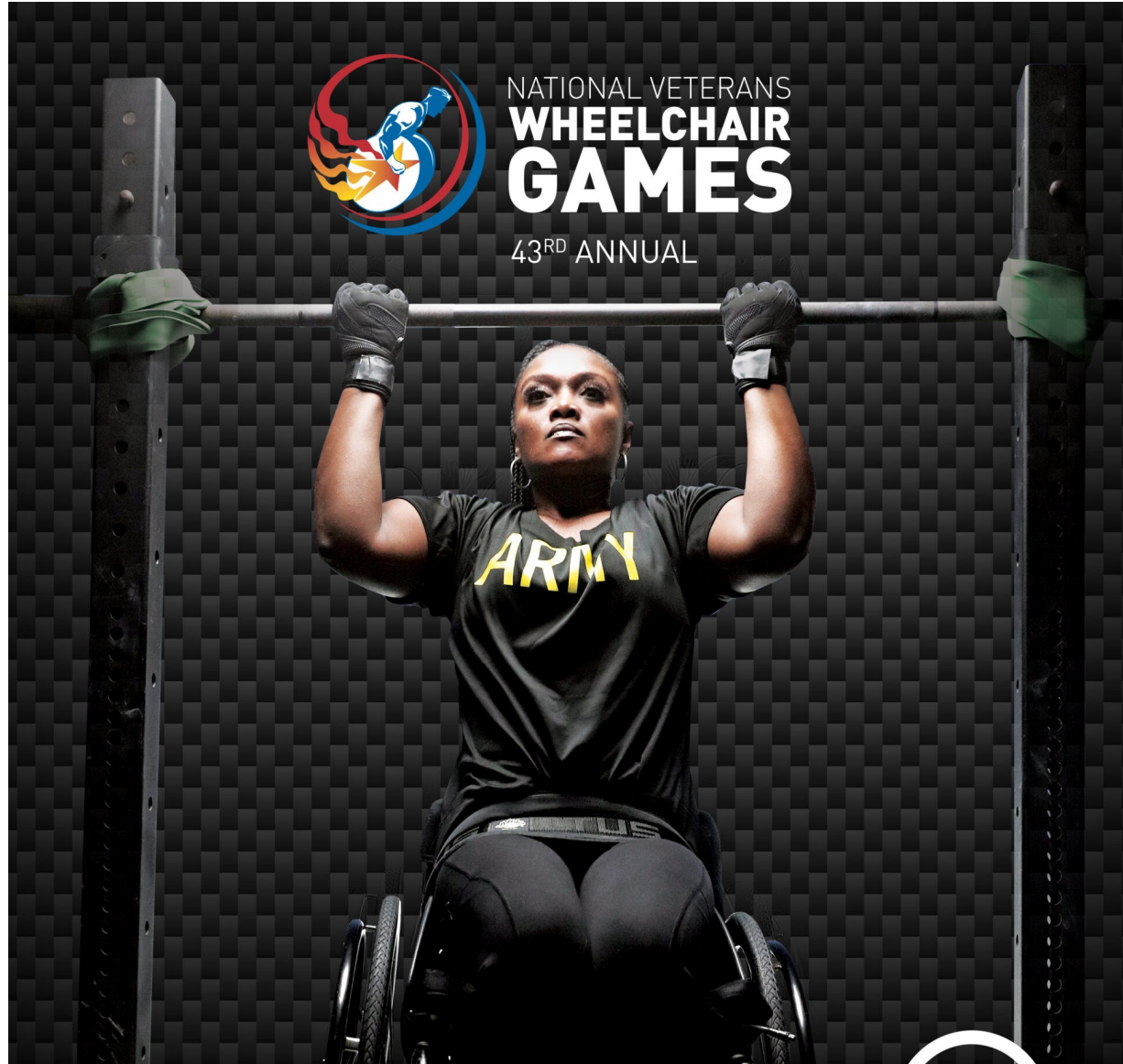

A Message From Our Executive Director

As Time goes on it seems that it is always harder to think of what to write for my Executive Director reports. It seems that I am talking about the change of seasons, the weather, or the loss of a member. After almost 25 years you would think it is easier writing this article, but it isn't. I reflect on my last 25 years here and all the changes that have taken place, some good, some bad. But overall, everything is as it should be I guess. We have come a long way, the chapter continues to grow and we do see changes within the chapter, need Board of Director members, some new ideas for the chapter and we continue to grow with these new ideas.

After the first of the year the Dallas VA finally did start the construction of the SCI Long Term Care Center and it should be done in 3 to 5 years. This will be the first 30 bed unit of its kind west of the Mississippi river and state of the art. We look forward to the day we can open the doors to our veterans and their families. But with construction comes growing pains, mostly with patient parking and smaller spaces for our clinics during construction. Please be mindful that this is a growing process, and we all need to be patient and considerate to the staff during this time. I know that we have been spoiled with the great care that the SCI staff has provided since the SCI Center opened in 1996 but remember once the SCI Long Term Care Center is completed our SCI Outpatient Care Unit will be bigger and better than it was before the construction. As for parking we still currently have SCI parking in the Freedom Garage and there is a shuttle service that will take you to either the South or North entrance of the main hospital. These shuttles run on a regular basis and are all wheelchair accessible, you just have to be patient and the drivers will make sure you get to and from the Freedom Garage safely. Hopefully by the end of April we will also have some SCI parking in the North parking lot near the North entrance, this will be a gated area and you can use the same code to access this area as the code to the SCI area in the Freedom garage. If you don't have the code, call the outpatient clinic or ask the staff for it and they will provide it to you. Remember this construction is to improve the care for all our SCI/D veterans and is a very good thing.

We are gearing up for the Veterans Wheelchair Games in New Orleans in July, our Rec Therapist is working hard to get all our veterans ready for the Games and are doing practices on a regular basis. If you are scheduled to do these practices, please make sure to attend as many as possible so that you will be great at the Games. Also thank Kelsi and Anna when you see them for the hard work, they are doing to get everyone registered and trained for the Games. Their commitment to the Games is what helps us have a great showing there. We look forward to having a lot of medals coming back to North Texas from these Games.

Finally on a sadder note, we again lost a former Board of Directors member who was active with the BOD until late last year. Glenn Davis passed away last month, this was a shock to a lot of us and he will be greatly missed. Glenn was very active not just with the BOD, but also with the fishing events as well as the Veterans Wheelchair Games. We will miss him dearly. Please take care of yourself and each other and have a great summer.

Having had the opportunity to attend a few of the Veterans Wheelchair Games, I thought I would take a moment to put down some thoughts about this absolutely amazing experience. The experience for myself and my wife began with the training prior to the games and came to a head the day we arrived at the airport to fly out. Meeting with the other veterans and waiting to board began the week long experience of the games themselves. You create friendships and camaraderie that is so easy to fall into because of mutual experiences in the military.

The first evening after arrival were the opening ceremonies. I was completely unprepared. When you first enter a room with 600 or more of your fellow wounded, injured or ill as in my case, you will be struck by the true cost of freedom that our brothers and sisters have paid for literally hundreds of years. As the Honor Guard carries out flag, (in this case dressed in period costumes from the Revolutionary War) I was speechless for several moments, thinking of all the sacrifices made to create and maintain our great Nation.

Once you begin the games, the time seems to rush by as you are so busy, first checking out the vendors in the great hall or maybe spread throughout the hallways. As you compete in the games, the competition, while serious is so friendly you find yourself watching other competitions and even cheering for people you have never met. By the end of the games, don't be surprised if you have made friends with people from places all over the world. We are looking forward to this year and seeing friends we have made and are in touch with from the very first game we attended.

If you have the opportunity to attend the games, please do so because it can be life changing and life affirming. Don't think you cannot do it, there is always a way to compete. Just contact the recreational therapists at your local VA to get started.

A powered exoskeleton that enables individuals with spinal cord injuries (T3-L5)* to stand and walk, offering a new level of independence.

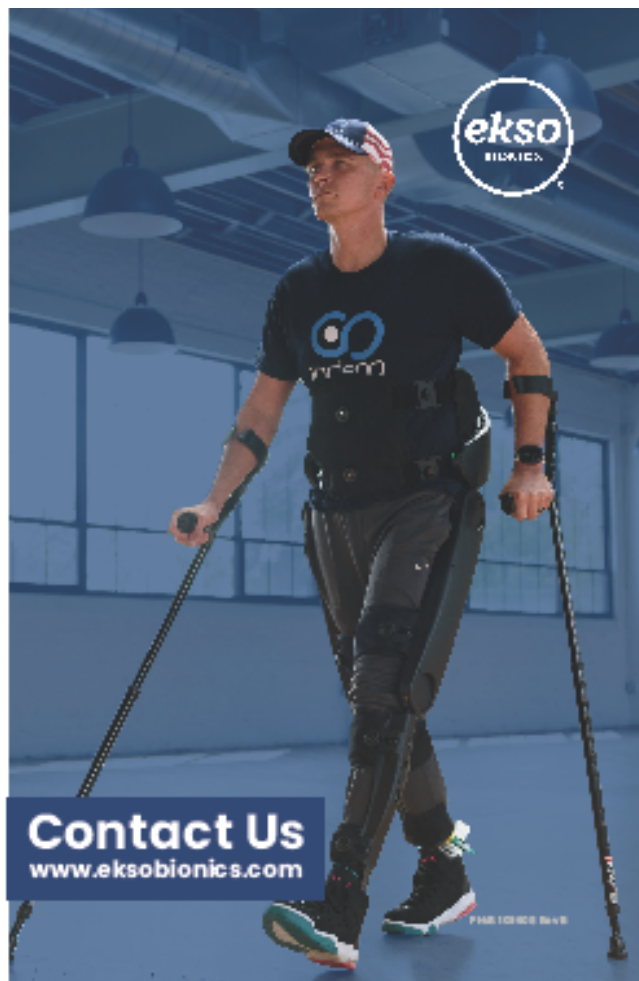

How to Get Qualified

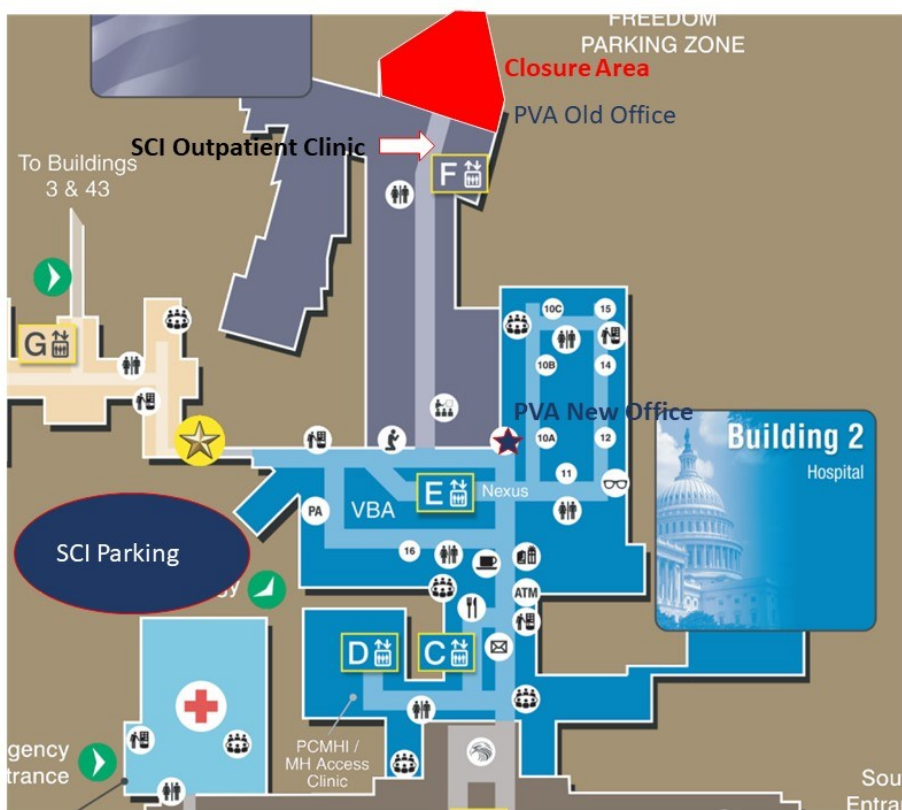
Contact us to find out if you may be eligible. An evaluation by your provider at a SCI/D center is required to determine eligibility for use of an Ekso Indego Personal device.

- Check in with reception desk located in outpatient clinic before going to waiting area.

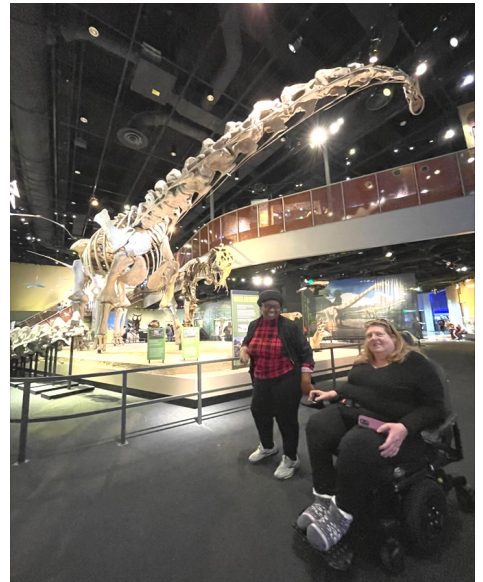

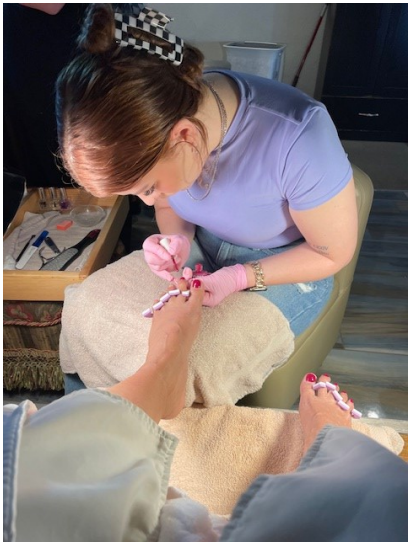

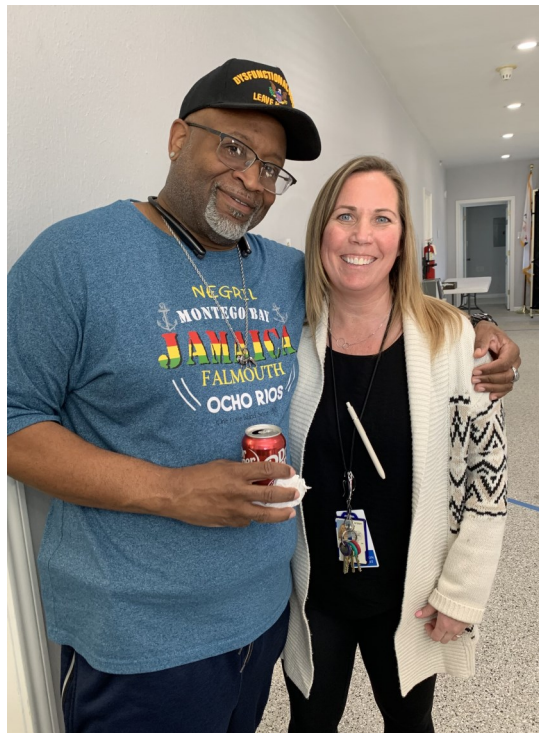
What is Recreation Therapy?

An individual is eligible for membership by meeting the following criteria: (1) is a citizen of the United States; (2) was regularly enlisted, inducted or commissioned for active duty service in the Army, Navy, Marine Corps, Air Force, or Coast Guard of the United States, or our allies as evidenced by other-than-dishonorable character of service documented by a verifiable DD-214 or DD-215 (entry-level separation not acceptable); (3A) was separated from the service in the Armed Forces under conditions other than dishonorable; or (3B) is on active duty or must continue to serve after the cessation of hostilities; and (4) has suffered a spinal cord injury or disease (such as MS, ALS), whether or not service connected in origin. LSPVA Uses a Point System for Members Wanting Funding to an Event

We will be using the point system for anyone who is wanting funding for an event. In order to get funding for an event you **MUST** volunteer and turn in your time sheets to Sonya. You may download a time sheet on our website and be sure to turn in before the 12th of every month.

Here are few examples of ways to volunteer and points you will earn.

Example Activity	Points
Volunteer at an official LSPVA event.....	20
Attend a Memorial or Funeral with Honor Guard.....	15
Write an (approved) original half page article for our newsletter.....	15
Sign up a new LSPVA member (PVA Employees not eligible).....	25
Chair an active committee of the LSPVA.....	25
Attend a monthly BOD meeting as a non board member.....	15
Direct individual fundraising efforts. Get 5 points for every \$50 raised.	

Please note in order for the volunteer to receive 100% funding to attend an event, the volunteer must have earned 100 points one month prior to the upcoming event. Points and funding are in percentages i.e. 50 point receive 50% funding, 25 points receive 25% funding, etc. Examples of approved events include, fishing tournaments, trap shoots, Golden Age Games, Wheel Chair Games, hand cycling, and Boccia.
